The MMEA AGM will also be virtual this year. As mentioned in our last email, members will receive the agenda, reports and information via email Oct. 12. You will have one week to submit questions regarding the information shared in the report. Voting will

take place via Google Forms from Oct. 19 - 21. Results of the online AGM will be sent to members Oct. 22-24 (the weekend of TEMPO).

MMEA ADVOCACY Initiatives (Submitted by Past President Virginia Helmner)

Members of MMEA and AMAM boards met with a committee from Manitoba Education and Shared Health on August 6 to discuss back to school guidelines. Concerns related to restrictions on singing and wind instruments and risk mitigation strategies were raised, and clarification was requested. Recent research was shared. We have been told that an updated Guidelines for Vocalists and Instrumentalists document is in the works. Our revised Returning to Manitoba Music Classrooms document has not been released at this point because we are reluctant to publish something that is not in line with public health recommendations and require further clarity before proceeding.

Members of the MMEA board met with Manitoba Education and Training personnel on August 10 to discuss music education under the BEST strategy. We expressed concerns about the lack of reference to music and arts education in the document. It was agreed that Arts education is an important part of K-12 education. Further discussions will take place in the coming months.

MMEA will once again request a meeting with the Minister of Education once the cabinet is settled after the October 30 leadership election.

MMEA continues to communicate with MTS on issues related to music education.

Thank you to all our partner organizations for their continued advocacy efforts. We look forward to meeting as a group in the coming weeks to discuss next steps for making our voices heard.

Throughout this pandemic, we have been forced to focus on the mental health of our students as well as our own mental health. Music education is an integral part of student emotional learning as well as our own mental well-being. - 1) If you would like step-by-step assistance on how to register *whether you are an MTS member, student, retired, or a non-MTS member*, please follow the steps listed in the attached document.
- 2) Online registration will start on September 1st, 2021 and can be accessed using the following link. You will need your MTS number. If you have forgotten your number, please use the "forgot your username" option or contact Danessa Poiron. If you are new to the registration process or do not have an MTS number, please use the "sign up now" option.

- 3) Online registration will close on October 22nd, 2021 at 4:00pm. Note: You MUST have your registration and payment completed before this time. If you are planning to send a cheque, it needs to be mailed by October 15th for us to receive it on time. Any registrations without payment will not be considered as being registered and those members will not receive the URL's to the sessions.
- 4) All registered participants will receive an email with the URL's to the sessions for the day on October 21st at 11pm to ensure you are ready for the start of the conference the next day. If you do not register until October 22nd, you will receive your URL's within a few minutes of completing your registration. If you do not receive this email, please call Danessa at (204) 471-1226. Registration will include replay sessions for one month, ending Monday, November 22nd, 2021. There will be no extension on the replay end date.
- 5) **Receipts**: Online payment will be accepted by credit card or PayPal at the time of registration. You will immediately receive a receipt after you have completed your payment using the email you have provided to MTS and will not receive another receipt.
