



Clinic on Clinics

Monday, October 3

Presented on Monday, September 26 by Brandon School Division Music Educator and School of Music alumna **Brooklyn Friesen**, this clinic was BUSMEA's kick off to professional development for the year! The Clinic on Clinics was planned to allow BU students to reflect on professional expectations, session content/methods, and organization as prospective mentors to young instrumentalists.

Double Feature Clinics: Wednesday, October 12 **Spring into Student Teaching & Job Interview Advice Session**

The "Spring into Student Teaching" session was hosted by third year Joint Department of Music Education students. The session addressed what you might experience when student teaching, how you are evaluated as a student teacher, and what is expected of you as a professional. The session was well attended by first and second year School of Music students.

The "Job Interview Advice" Session was presented by Tyra Zander and Aurora Whitehead. Tyra and Aurora are recent graduates who are currently music educators in the Westman Area. Tyra and Aurora talked about how to prepare for an interview and how the interview process can work. The session concluded with a Q&A session.

Tempo Watch Party Friday, October 21

To engage with the online Tempo Conference, BUSMEA hosted a Tempo Watch Party for students, faculty, and Westman music educators. Attendees were required to present proof of conference registration to attend.
