
Guidelines:

- Non-competitive showcase: feedback provided by a local professional musician
- Registration deadline is March 22/24
- Band registration is free (free admission for family and friends)

Tentative Launch Event

Student Launch Event February 2, 2024 at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights

This February, the Canadian Museum for Human Rights will launch the new *Beyond the Beat* exhibition, exploring the impact of music on various human rights movements. As the exhibit opens, we are hoping to be able to hold a *launch event* to introduce students to *Beyond the Beat* and related school programming. The *tentative plan* is to bring students to the Museum the afternoon of February 2, 2024 to hear from Tom Morello, of Rage Against the

Machine, and have a sneak peek at the new exhibition. The event has not been confirmed as we need to first gauge interest to make sure it is doable.

Student Self-Guided Experience

This new exhibition will offer an opportunity for students **passionate about music** to learn about how musicians use their talents to **create change** in the world and will encourage them to think about how they can do the same. The <u>Beyond the Beat Self-Guided Experience: the Be an Upstander Tour</u> will be offered from the **start of February** until the end of the 2024 school year for **grade 5-12 classes**.

Be an Upstander Showcase

Showcase May 23, 2024 at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights

The school programming for *Beyond the Beat* runs parallel to our **Be an Upstander program**. An upstander is someone who recognizes injustice and uses their strengths, gifts and abilities to create change. The *Beyond the Beat* exhibition features upstanders who used and continue to use their **musical abilities** to help raise awareness and take a stand against injustices.

The Be an Upstander Showcase is an annual event which amplifies **students' voices** and work for human rights. Students are invited to share their work in the Museum galleries and talk with visitors about how they are taking action to turn injustice into justice. Inspired by the *Beyond the Beat* exhibition, this year the showcase will expand to include a **music** element allowing students who have been working on


music projects for human rights to perform what they have prepared. This year's showcase will be **May 23, 2024** at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights.

The Brandon University Student Music Educator's Association is pleased to provide a summary of our 2024 Da Capo Music Education Conference to members of the Manitoba music education community.

BUSMEA was thrilled to host their annual Da Capo Conference at the Brandon University School of Music on Saturday, January 20, 2024. We welcomed over 70 attendees to campus, and were happy to partner with the Initiative for Future Music Educators (IFME) to invite high school students to join us for the day, free of charge! The 18th Annual Da Capo Conference was a wonderful way to connect music education students with current music educators in our province and learn from their knowledge and experiences.

We were pleased to have Alexis Silver kick off the day by sharing a session entitled "The Value of Teaching with Values," in which she examined data on the positive impacts of music education in the province of Manitoba, and encouraged participants to share their own values and goals for their programs, while emphasizing the importance of wellness and self-care for educators.

The conference included sessions covering topics such as Orff Education, conducting fundamentals, mock interviews for graduating music education students, rehearsal strategies, incorporating pop music into elementary music classes, fundamentals of a successful choir program, creating inclusive spaces in music, percussion pedagogy, and EA's in the music classroom.

We were joined by some of the province's top music educators, including Kevin Doell, Dawn Muir, Dr. Wendy Zander, Jeni Taylor, Sean Irvine, Kelsey Simpson, Graydon Cramer, Dr. Nora Wilson, and Avonlea Armstrong-Green. We were pleased to be joined by the Vincent Massey High School Sr. Band students, who served as the music ensemble for our band rehearsal session. Attendees of the conference included music educators, music education students, administrators, education students, high school students, and performance students.

I'm not sure how to feel about that, given that it is currently melting outside. This sure has been one topsy-turvey winter. Things feel a little topsy-turvy in the arts world too, yet so many amazing performances with wonderful audiences have happened so far this year!

On Thursday, March 7th we are presenting our fourth and final **UnTuxed Matinee for Students**: Grieg UnTuxed. This matinee is also what has become one of my favourite events of the year—a Relaxed Experience. Relaxed experiences (also known as sensory-friendly) are designed to help everyone feel welcome and to experience the concert in whatever way is most comfortable for them. I encourage you to <u>learn more!</u>

Please note that demand is high for our Adventures in Music concerts, and all three English-language concerts are completely sold out. If you want to bring students to the French concert, don't delay—get your order in as soon as possible to avoid missing out. Thank you to all the educators who support WSO and share these experiences with your learners.

I highly recommend considering our Musical Discoveries concert this May, "The Twins and the Monster". Set in a forest in Africa, this imaginative tale by award-winning author Tolola M. Mollel uses carved masks, singing, and movement to bring to life the story of young twins, Azizi and Aziza. Together, they work to outwit a gruesome monster and bring peace to their devastated village. Based on a traditional African folk tale, this triumphant story travels through dark forests, vast plains and spooky swamps to deliver a thrilling tale of family unity and courage with the help of a lush and magical score by Canadian composer John Estacio.

In case you missed it, we have expanded our <u>Tickets for Schools</u> program. This is an easy and affordable way to order specially-priced tickets to eligible concerts that you can then give to your students as rewards, or however you see fit, to encourage them to go enjoy a live symphony experience.

Despite Merv's prediction, I think spring is just around the corner!
